Highlights of XXI Annual Conference of Indian Academy of Cytologists to held in Manipal on 26th and 27th October 1991.

The XX1st annual conference of Indian Academy of Cytologists will be held at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal on 26th and 27th of October, 1991. Manipal has already hosted the All India Pathologists and Microbiologists conference twice. Manipal is set in rural surroundings and is known for its hospitality, warmth and comfort to the delegates. Manipal is situated between the emerald green western ghats and turquoise blue Arabian sea. There are many temples and tourist spots like Udupi, the abode of Lord Krishna. The Organising secretary of the conference is Dr. Nalini Venugopal, and she is working hard with her team to make this a great success. Highlights of the conference are as follows.

1. Pre conference workshop on Cervical and Vaginal cytology to be conducted by Dr. Sreedevi Amma, Trivandrum on 25th October 1991.
2. Cipla Academy oration to be delivered by Dr. Shobha Grover, Nagpur - "Role of Immunocytochemistry in Diagnosis and Prognosis of Malignancy".
3. Diagnostic Slide Seminar (Ernest Fernandez award)-
4. Symposium on CNS cytology to be organised by Dr. S. K. Shankar NIMHANS, Bangalore.

5. Nalini Bai Thakkar prize to be given to the best paper presented by a Medical Doctor in cytopathology. The age of the speaker must be less than 35 years. Candidates must bring their birth certificate for age verification during the conference.
6. Jwala Devi Award to be given to the cytotechnician/cytotechnologist presenting the best paper at the conference on any aspect of cytological techniques.
7. Dr. Satya Monga Award in immunocytochemistry to be given to the best published paper in Immunocytochemistry (No age bar)
 - a) Paper should have been published after 1988.
 - b) Publication must be in an indexed journal.
 - c) Candidate should be one of the authors of the article.
 - d) Candidate should submit in writing permission from Co-authors for entering the paper for the award.
 - e) Reprints of such papers should be sent to the Secretary IAC latest by September 10th 1991.
8. Dr. Bhaskar Reddy award to be given to the Cytotechnician standing first in the National Examination for cytotechnician conducted by IAC.

Activities of the Accreditation and Examination Committee.

At the XXth annual conference of I. A. C. the report of A&E committee was circulated by Dr. Usha Luthra. There are twenty five accredited laboratories for diagnostic services and eight for training and examination. She presented another document which was on standing committee of IAC "an over view of decade and a half". It contained the activities of A&E committee in the previous 15 years. The general body highly appreciated the efforts by Prof. Luthra as Chairperson of A&E committee. A body was constituted for human resource development in the field of cytology. The following are the members - Dr. Kusum Verma, Dr. Dilip Das, Dr. Shobha Grover & Dr. Sri Devi Amma.

Dr. Kusum Verma has already collected information regarding this. Efforts are being made to start Diploma or D. M. course for qualified pathologists in cytology.

Activities of the Section of Cervical Pathology and Colposcopy

1. Dr. Adolf Staffl, Prof. Wisconsin Medical College and Past President of International Federation of Cervical Pathology and Colposcopy visited India in January 1991.

He conducted a workshop in Coimbatore which was organised by Dr. M. Govindarajan. It was well attended.

He visited Bombay and gave a lecture on Cervicography.

2. Dr. Ravathi Ananth of Madras conducted 2 workshops on Cervical Cytology and Colposcopy. One was in Cancer Institute and the other in A. V. Hospital. 50 Doctors participated.
3. 18th Annual Course in Cytology was conducted by Cytology Clinic (AMWI) in Bombay. There were 32 participants. Dr. Kusum Kapila gave the Advani Braganza Oration. Dr. B. K. Goyal was the Chief guest.

1. A workshop on Cytology of Breast lesions was held in the department of Pathology, S. M. S. Medical College, Jaipur on 1st April 1991 as a continuing Medical Education Programme for Pathologists of Rajasthan State. Though the workshop was arranged for 25 delegates, 28 participants attended it.

All associate members of the Indian Academy of Cytologists who are members of at least *three years* standing are now eligible to become *life* members by paying Rs. 500/— if they satisfy any one of the following *four* criteria.

- a) B. Sc. Medical Laboratory technology with one year of cytology experience.
- b) Passed the National Examination of cytotechnician/cytotechnologist conducted by the I. A. C.
- c) Won awards given by Indian Academy of Cytologists.
- d) Author or Co-author of two published papers on Cytology in indexed journals.

In the newsletter of December 1990 under the section of awards, it was inadvertently published that "Dr. Chandralekha Shroff becomes the first fellow of IAC in India after the introduction of the examination". I have received letters from various members of I. A. C. that they have also successfully cleared this examination i. e. Dr. Kusum Kapila in 1986, Dr. Zubair Affandi in 1987 and Dr. Dilip Das in 1988/89.

OBITUARY

Dr. B. N. Purandare, a doyen in the field of Gynaecology and Obstetrics, with keen interest in cytology, was born on 27th October 1911. He passed away on 10th November 1990. He graduated from Seth G. S. Medical College, Bombay in 1934 and did his M. D. in Obstetrics and Gynaecology in 1937. He qualified for FRCS (Ed) in 1939. He worked as Hon. Asst. Prof. of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at his Almamater from 1941 to 1957 and subsequently was appointed as emeritus professor at the same institute. He was the second president of IAC in 1976. He was honoured in 1972 with "Padma Bhushan" by Government of India and the "Dhanwantri Award" for year 1980 for his outstanding work in the field of Obstetrics & Gynaecology and family planning.

was very simple and unassuming. He had great interest in astrology, palmistry, music and drama. During his preconference visit to Nagpur in 1990, he had predicted that he would not be able to attend the conference in December 1990 and unfortunately his prediction came true.

Dr. Purandre has left behind many admirers in the field of Gynaecology and cytology. His guidance and involvement will always be cherished by the members of the IAC.
