Highlights of XXII Annual Conference of Indian Academy of Cytologists, Pune 17th - 18th January 1993

This conference was organised by Indian Association of Practising Pathologists Pune branch and was dedicated to the memory of late Dr. M. B. Gharpure a Senior Practising Pathologist of Pune.

When we landed in Pune; the pleasant weather and quiet atmosphere balmed out anxiety and apprehension about the success of the conference. On 16th January 93 K. E. M. Hospital Pune was buzzing with 25 participants, Dr. Kusum Kapila & her team for the Pre-conference workshop on 'Breast Cytology' a knowledge must for a novice in the field. Typical cool climate of Pune was welcoming about 130 delegates form all over the country for the inaugural function in Hotel Blue Diamond on 17th January. The inaugural function was graced by dignitaries like Padmabhushan Dr. Banu Coyagi & Dr. P. B. Desai, Senior Pathologist Dr. R. V. Junnarkar, I. A. C. President Dr. Shobha Grover and Secretary Dr. Maya Lulla along with office bearers of I. A. C. & of organising committee. In her Presidential Address Dr. Grover wished that the mandate of this twenty two years old academy should be strengthened. This academy advocates that cytology is an easy and cost effective method of diagnosing cancer at an early stage. During the inaugural function our president was wearing a nice Presidential Medal. It is worth mentioning that so far our academy has not had the Presidential Medal but this year through the good offices of Dr. Usha Saraiya we have a medal. The grand old man of Pathology Dr. R. V. Junnarkar was felicitated on this occasion to celebrate his 75th Birthday.

Inaugural function was followed by Shireen

Mahataji oration by Dr. P. B. Desai, Director Tata Memorial Hospital on 'The Impact of Cytodiagnosis on clinical oncology. 'In very simple words he gave a bird's eye view about an explosion called cyctology and its overall effect on oncology. He did not forget to caution us about its overenthusiastic use and disadvantages. Cipla academy oration by Sreedevi Amma on 'Strategies for Cancer Control in India' and panel discussion on ' Human Resource Development', chaired by Dr. Usha Saraiya made us aware of the practical problems and difficulties in implementing downstaging which infrastructure of trained and competent personnels at all levels. In Diagnostic Slide Seminar by Dr. Nalini Venugopal we saw interesting & brain tickling smears. In this conference we saw a total change in scenario as practical day to day problems were being discussed and stressed upon I. A. C. members.

On both days thirty six young enthusiastic and experienced people including Cytotechnician and cytotechnologists presented papers on various disciplines in cytology. This organization encourages paramedical personnels to share the platform to express their views. Their confident participation in panel discussion and paper presentation assures us that our

organization is achieving the goal.

Report of Accreditation and Examination Committee

Dr. Kusum Verma, Chairperson of the committee gave a very lucid account of the activities of the committee.

Important points which need to be mentioned are -

- For Accreditation of cytology laboratory for examination and training the workload should be defined as 3,000 cases instead of 5,000 smears. For diagnostic services it should be 500 cases.
- Cytotechnicians and Cytotechnologists Examination 1993

Indian Academy of Cytologists would be conducting the above examinations for the year 1993 in September - October, 1993. The eligibility criteria for appearing in these examinations are modified as follows:-

Cytotechnician: Higher Secondary in biological sciences with diploma in Medical Lab. Technology and six months experience in Cytology / Higher Secondary in biological sciences with 5 years experience in cytology.

Cytotechnologist: - M. Sc. medical lab. technology with cytology as special subject / B. Sc. Medical Lab.

Technology with experience in cytology for one year / 5 years experience in cytology as lab. technician following diploma in medical lab. technology / 5 years experience in cytology as lab. technician following passing the cytotechnicians examination conducted by IAC. Those desirous of taking this examination may write to Dr. Kusum Kapila, Convenor, A&E Committee, C/o Department of Pathology, AIIMS, New Delhi - 110 029, for obtaining details of syllabus venue and dates etc.

3. Cytotechnologists and cytotechnicians Examination, 1992.

Ten candidates, one cytotechnologist and nine cytotechnicians have been declared successful in the examinations conducted by IAC at Trivandrum on 24-25th September, 1992. Heartiest congratulations to all of them form the members of Indian Academy of Cytologists. Ms. K. A. Sreekala and Mr. T. O. Soy will be awarded Sushill Malhotra and Dr. Bhaskar Reddy Awards respectively for standing first in the examinations. We hope that both of them will attend the next annual conference and receive their awards in person.

Activities of the Section of Cervical Pathology and Colposcopy

Dr Usha Saraiya, Chairperson C. P. C. briefed us abuot the activities of the committee. There are three major centres in India for promoting the technique of colposcopy.

1. In Delhi Dr. S. K. Das has been conducting programmes & training personnels. 2. In Madras Dr. Revathi Ananth has opened a, 'SCHOOL OF COLPOSCOPY', It will impart intensive coaching for handling colposcope to maximum five participants for 5 days. Dr. Darshana Daftary, Dr. Maya Lulla, Dr. Jyoti Taskar and their dedicated band of workers organised 20th Annual Course in April 1992 at Cama and Albless Hospital. Another course was conducted by Bombay obstretic and Gynaecological society. Together 70 participants were trained. Dr. Usha Saraiya chairperson travelled to Australia in May to participate in 11th international congress of cytology and to Eastern Europe as visiting professor in colposcopy.
