


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

I feel privileged for having been nominated as the President of the IAC for the year 1995, particularly this being the silver jubilee year of the Academy, my warm appreciation's and deep gratitude to all for bestowing upon me this honor. My

association with the Academy is since its inception. The memory of its meeting held in 1971 at the I.C.M.R headquarters is still vivid in my mind with only a few handful of delegates being present. The concern at that time was how to popularize cytology in the country and develop trained personnel in this speciality. The practice of cytology at this time was limited to a few placed only and was confined to cervical cancer screening and exfoliative cytology of some other body sites. Very few pathologists felt primarily interested in the specialty and shunned the laborious time consuming screening of smears for malignant cells with little intelectual skill and excitement involved. The wide potential of the specialty attracting multiple disciplines of clinical Medicine was still unexplored. To-day FNAC along with emergence of high precision Radio-imaging techniques and flexible fiberoptic endoscopes has made it possible to collect material for cytological examination from all possible sites in the body. Thus the practice of cytology now is

no longer limited to screening for malignant cells only but to diagnose both benign and malignant lesions paralleling histopathology diagnosis. Brain teasing exercise of assessing cell patterns for morphological diagnosis is exciting for intellectual minds with lot of scope for discussion and new observations. No wonder more and more pathologists are taking a fancy to this and take pride in identifying themselves with this specialty. Easy nontraumatic techniques of sample collection and early availability of results make it even more popularly acceptable to the consumers (patients and clinicians) with increasing demand for introducing cytodiagnostic services in many hospitals and Institutions in the country. But how well we know that an efficient tool in inefficient hands can be disastrous. The questions which one faces to-day are : Do we have enough trained cytopathologists for this purpose? Considering how little cytology training is included in the M.D. Pathology training program (except for at few places), who should be fit for the practice of cytopathology? Should there be post-M.D. specialization courses at the University level to qualify for the practice of this specialty? All of us in the Academy need to give a thought to this for the specialty to flourish in the right direction and to avoid malpractice. Of course with this our prime responsibility of more laborious cancer screening programs should not overlooked of which cervix and breast are the chief targets.

HIGHLIGHTS OF XXIV ANNUAL CONFERENCE A/C

XXIVth Conference was succefully held at Cancer institute Madras and was organised by Dr. Revathi Ananth. Over 200 delegates attended it and 72 papers were presented.

For the first time IAC had 2 workshops. One on `FNAC of lung which was conducted by Dr. Sukumaran of Cancer Institude Madras and Second on `Colposcopy and Microcalposcopy' by Dr. Revathi Ananth' about 30-40 candidates participated in each workshop.

The Cipla Academy oration was delivered by Dr. Chandralekha Shroff, Prof, of Pathology, LTM Medical College Sion Bombay on ``Cyto Diagnosis of Breast lesions." Recent trends and problems were highlighted.

The Shireen Mehtaji oration was delivered by Dr. V. Shantha, Director Cancer Institute on "Strategies for cancer control in women."

Diagnostic slide seminar was presented to Dr. N.K. Chaturvedi from New Delhi, Symposium on Quality Control in cytology was moderated by Dr. S.K. Gupta & other participants were Dr. Sreedevi Amma. Dr. Kusum Verma & Dr. Rajwanshi.

OBLITUARY



On Dec. 9, 1994 Professor Meera Aikat an eminent cytologist on the Indian scene passed away. She served at Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education & Research (P.G.I.), Chandigarh from 1964-1982 as head of Cytology & Gynaecological Pathology division of Pathology Department. Under her able guidance later this division got the status of an

independant Department. Under her able guidance later this division got the status of an independant Department, the only of its kind in the country. Her name could be counted amongst a few named pioneers of cytology in this country. She was the founder memeber of the IAC, served the Academy in various advisory capacities, remained Secretary (1979-1978) and President (1981) and was receipient of the Academy oration (1974). She was held in high esteem by all the students, collegues and memebers of the Academy not only for her professional dedication and academic achievements, but also for her gentle and loving personality, full of compassion for others. Both cytology and the Academy were very close to her heart and she was always concerned for high quality performance in providing service and training to patients and students. Equally great was her

dedication as a wife to Esteemed late Prof. B.K. Aikat, Director Professor of Pathology and Dean at P.G.I and founder of pathology at many places in the country. Her devotion to him surpassed even her love for her profession so much so that after his passing away in 1981, she decided to take voluntary retirement from P.G.I. so as to be able to take care of the private Pathology laboratory strarted by him at Chandigarh (presently known as Aikat Memorial laboratory). It seems she was unable to reconcile the great vaccum of his loss leading to her rapid deteroration of health and untimely loss. I having had long years of association with her, feel grieved to think that she is no more physically present with us, but the foot prints of her memory shall be permanant in my mind and also to many others who came in contact with her. She stood for dedication to service in all spheres of life combined with humility and compassion, which itself was an inspiration for all the students to do and achieve their best. Her surviving family is resisting at Chandigarh and consists of an only Son-MrAmitab Aikat, Engineer and his wife and two children: a son and a daughter. Their loss indeed is great, difficult to be consoled by words. I on behalf of the Academy and myself sincerely pray for their happiness and welfare.
