Dr Anita M. Borges

Dr Anita Maria Borges MBBS, MD, FRCPath, Indias top most Surgical Pathologist and Pathology Educator of National and International repute, a towering personality, a giant and colossus in the field of Diagnostic Oncopathology, a Teacher par Excellence. a Medical Researcher, a warm friendly and humble person passed away on 18 September 2025 at Gorakhpur UP, following a massive Myocardial infarction. She was invited by the Raghav Das Medical College Gorakhpur to conduct a CME Continuing Medical Education Programme scheduled to be held on 19th and 20th September 2025 She was 78 .

Dr Anita Borges served in the top most Cancer hospitals in India. She was the Professor and Head of the Surgical Pathology Tata Memorial Hospital, where she served for 25 years, Director of the Center for Excellence in Oncopathology Wadala. Mumbai and the Head of the Histopathology Department S.L Raheja Fortis Hospital, Mahim. Mumbai. In all these centres She received the cases from all over Mumbai as well as all over India and abroad. Her Diagnostic acumen in Histopathology and Cytopathology was superb.

She completed her MBBS and MD Pathology from the Topiwala National Medical College and B.Y.L. Nair Charitable Hospital Mumbai Central.

She was the Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists London UK and was trained in Royal Msrden Hospital for Cancer in London and the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York USA. both world famous and the top Cancer Centers

She was a mentor, role model, very humane. a great

human being having helped millions of Cancer patients and their families Her areas of expertise were Head. Neck Cancers, Lymphoma and metastasis and General oncopathology as well as Cancrrs and Benign Tumors and tumor like conditions of all organs and systems.

She was a legendary figure known for her dedication, commitment. hard work. sincerity and humour

She was involved in teaching online as well as CMEs and Conferences on site all over India and abroad. She taught students the concepts, basic histology. Critical thinking, to ask questions. Problem solving, algorithmic approach to diagnose. She had a very profound and deep knowledge of the subject and was popular at Conferences of pathologists, Oncosurgeons, Medical Oncologists. Radiologists, Radiotherapists, Physicians. Surgeons. Orthopedic Surgeons and the General Medical practitioners, Microbiologists, immunologists, Molecular biologists. She was charming, charismatic and a crowd puller, and was always surrounded by students and Consultants wanting to learn more.

Dr Anita kept updating both her knowledge, skill and technology which today is galloping at a fast pace.

She received many Awards and Orations all over India and occupied several prestigious positions in Academic bodies like Chairperson of NABL, Vice President of the International College of Pathologists, Dean of the International College of Pathologists Indian Division and a member of NAMS National Academy of Medical Sciences.



She has numerous publications and was on the Editorial Board of many journals. She was on the WHO Panel for Head and Neck Cancers

I first met Dr Anita in 1984 as a PG student during the CME in Pathology in JN Medical College, of KLE Society in Belgaum where she was a regular Faculty every year. Her important points and messages are remembered till date. I also trained with Dr Anita in Tata Memorial Hospital in 1987 and later on learnt a lot of Pathology from her.

Her patients were from the poor socioeconomic section to the rich powerful. VIPs like CMs, Governors, Ministers, Bureaucrats, Doctors, industrialists, and the common man, women and children.

She treated all equally, was kind to the servants, Nurses, Technicians, Artists, Medical Social workers and all others.

She will leave behind a void that will be difficult to fill. But her Legacy will remain and be carried forward by her students and juniors.

For a newly launched Visiting Faculty Programme in Goa Medical College in 2008 the first Faculty to be invited were Dr Anita M Borges and Dr Bhavin Jankaria, a renowned Radiologist from Mumbai.

She was known for her sartorial elegance, grace and charm. Her taste of the cuisines and wines were very classy Italian and French wines. She took to the dance floor for the pathology Conferences banquets.

I invited her more than 15 times to Goa for our CMEs and Conferences. She loved Goa as she hailed from Ussaim in Bardez, loved Goan cuisine, music, and the Goan ethos. She was the daughter of Dr Ernest

Joaquim Joseph Borges, a famous Cancer Surgeon who was the Director of Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. Two roads are named after Dr Ernest Borges in Parel, Mumbai, next to Tata Memorial Hospital and in Dona Paula, next to the Cancer Hospital now run by the Manipal group. Her brother Dr Eric Borges, a Cardiologist in Bombay Hospital, and now into palliative care. The entire family is truly world class and they donated a Scholarship in Goa Medical College to mark the Centenary of Dr Ernest Borges a few years ago, for the doctors of GMC to undergo training in Oncology in TMH.

Dr Anita has taken the standard of Oncopathology to a very high level, being a perfectionist for excellence. She is an inspiration to the next generation of Pathologists and her ideology was excellence in all areas. She had a command of the language as well as the subject.

Thank you Dr Anita for all your help, advice and opinions to me, my family, my patients referred to you, the Goan patients, as well as imparting the knowledge of Pathology as well as coming to Goa for my CMEs and Conferences. Dr Anita Borges never charged us a single paisa for her visit to Goa. And a gesture I will never forget, she returned the cheque I gave her to cover her air travel.

She also came for the 100 years of CMM celebration CME. My heartfelt condolences to Dr Anita Borges family. May God give eternal rest and peace to her soul. Also, I am sure that her legacy will continue.

The chairperson was Dr. Bharat Rekhi, TMH Mumbai, who introduced the session with the background and concept. The resource faculty were Prof. R.G.W. Pinto, Goa, Prof. Radhika Srinivasan, PGIMER, Chandigarh, Prof. Nalini Gupta, PGIMER, Chandigarh, and Prof. Bharat Rekhi, Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai. The presenters covered, Milan System for Salivary gland cytopathology, The Bethesda system for Thyroid cytopathology, Paris System for reporting Urinary cytology, The WHO-IARC reporting system for lymph node cytopathology, The Bethesda system for reporting cervical cytology, The WHO-IARC reporting system for lymph node cytopathology and The International System for serous effusions, respectively. 


Fig1: MGG X 400






Fig2: ZN stain X 1000

Answers to previous Quiz

- 1. Chondroid hamartoma** of the lung (also known as a pulmonary hamartoma): It is the most common benign lung tumor composed of a mix of mature tissues like cartilage, fat, and smooth muscle. They are usually small, but can sometimes be large, endobronchial (blocking the airway), or have cystic components, leading to symptoms such as cough, shortness of breath, etc. Imaging, shows characteristic “popcorn-like” calcifications. Surgical removal is the definitive treatment
- 2. Symplastic scrotal leiomyoma:** It is a rare, benign tumor of the scrotum that arises from smooth muscle, characterized by bizarre, atypical-looking nuclei (symplastic cells) but lacking other signs of malignancy. While generally benign, this variant presents a potential diagnostic challenge because its atypical features can mimic a malignant leiomyosarcoma, necessitating close follow-up after complete surgical removal.
- 3. Rhinoscleroma:** It is a chronic bacterial infection caused by *Klebsiella rhinoscleromatis*, which affects the nose and other upper respiratory tract structures. It progresses through three stages: catarrhal (early inflammation), granulomatous (mass formation), and sclerotic (scarring), leading to symptoms like nasal obstruction, discharge, and potential airway narrowing. Treatment involves prolonged courses of antibiotics, often combined with surgical debridement for severe cases, though relapse rates are high.
